Chief Kinney, Police Department, Chief gave an update on the city archery program stating that the ordinance went into effect on November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Since then we have had 9 applications to hunt within the city. One permit was issued and 8 were denied. The hunting season started on Sept 30th, 2023 and runs to February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2024. We got a late start this year, the end of November and beginning of December is sort of passed the prime time for bow hunting anywhere in the state of Ohio. They anticipate next year there will likely be far more interest and a lot more hunters signing up and completing the application process.

The Port Authority has been designated by the County Commissioners as the lead entity for the State Grants. This was made on a first come first serve basis and so we are in competition with pretty much everybody across the State of Ohio for this grant, and that is why the emergency clause is needed. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of D. Simpson, J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, and J. Shields. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 021-24 passed by the yea votes of J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, J. Shields, and D. Simpson.
