During Black History Month The City Salutes Wilda A. Bell Howard

The City of Medina salutes Wilda Bell Howard, for a lifetime of service to her community. Wilda worked for 30 years as an Ombudsman for the Summit County Department of Job and Family Services. She moved to the City of Medina, married, and raised three children. In 1985, she ran for and won the seat as the Ward 1 Councilperson, where she served from 1986 thru 1988. She decided to run for the City Council President, in 1987 and served in that seat from 1988 thru 1991. She was the first woman of color to hold both of these prestigious offices. Wilda was also an active member of Second Baptist Church. Wilda was a servant-leader who spent her life being a voice for those who had no voice.



McDowell-Phillips House Now On National Register Of Historic Places

Congratulations to the Medina County Historical Society and historian Joann King for the extensive restoration and research that resulted in the 1890 Queen Ann shingle-style house at 206 South Prospect Street being approved by the Ohio State Preservation Office and then the National Park Service National Register of Historic Places. This addition to the growing list of properties in the city joins the H. G. Blake House, the King Phillips-Deibel House, Medfair Heights Apartments Historic District, the Medina Courthouse, the Farmers Exchange, Medina Public Square Historic District, A. I. & E. R. Root Homestead, Judge Albert Munson House, St Paul's Episcopal Church, and the Pease Federal Building. While other cities build new buildings that look historic, Medina has the real thing. The Medina County Historical Society holds regular open houses for both the McDowell-Phillips House and the John Smart House so you can learn about the history of the people who build Medina.
