Medina County Property Taxes have been mailed and the First Half payment is due by Friday, February 14. They can be paid online, in person at the Medina County Treasurer's office at 144 North Broadway, or in the Dropbox at the County Administration Building. Please be aware that the Dropbox has been relocated to the parking lot area from the original area near the Broadway Street entrance. There are arrows visible on the driveway to show the correct way to proceed through the Dropbox area.



More Fiber Internet Coming to Medina

Construction teams may already be working in your neighborhood placing Frontier fiber-optic lines on poles or underground. These lines join the ones previously installed by Armstrong and Omni-Fiber. As required by law, Frontier will locate and mark existing underground utilities to prevent damage and ensure public safety, by using temporary paint markings in or near your yard. If utilities are underground, Frontier's contractors will excavate in the public right-of-way to make a path for the cable and then restore any impacted streets, sidewalks or landscaping. If utilities are on utility poles, they will need access to any facilities or poles on your property, including backyards. While working in your neighborhood, Frontier contractors will leave a door hanger on your door that has the direct line of someone to call if you have a concern. Please hold on to the door hanger as you may need the Frontier number on the red side of the it so you can call Frontier directly at 330-721-3927. Construction will continue into 2026.
