
April 8: Medina City Ward 1 and Ward 2 combined Community Meeting, 7 pm, Fire Station 1, 300 West Reagan Parkway.

City Wards 1 & 2 To Host Community Meeting - April 8

All city council members will be on hand, plus the Mayor and Department Heads to answer all of your questions, and let you know about upcoming projects around the city. All city residents are welcome.

City Complies With State Requirements

In October of 2024, the State enacted Sub. House Bill 74 that requires the placement of automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in each public recreation facility where organized sports teams are playing. In 2024, Medina had 3,863 participants in youth sports in Reagan Park, Huffman-Cunningham Park, Ray Mellert Park, Fred Greenwood Park and Sam Masi Park. The sports include lacrosse, baseball, softball, football and soccer. The city applied for and was awarded a grant from the Medina Hospital Foundation Strategic Priorities Fund for the purchase of this life-saving equipment. The units have been installed. All coaching staff members will have keys to access the AEDs, and will be trained to use the units in April. The city and the sports programs want to thank Dr. Shewbridge and the Medina Hospital Foundation for their support with this important project.



Two Lights For Tomorrow - April 18, 8:30 pm

Help us kick off the America 250 celebration with this nationwide event called Two Lights for Tomorrow! Bring your lanterns and join us on the evening of April 18, at 8:30 pm, in the Medina Square, for a commemorative program of Paul Revere's famed ride to let the colonists know that the Redcoats were coming.
