Reports of Municipal Officers:

Dennis Hanwell, Mayor, reported the following:

- 1) Police Chief testing in process. Assessment center completed and written test scheduled for September 14th, 2017. Candidates then have a period to review before list and top names are certified to me. Hope to complete by early October.
- 2) Tunnel to Towers event Sunday, September 10th. We attended and participated in by our staff and safety forces. Monies raised help build "smart homes" for our wounded military members missing multiple limbs so they may live independently safely.
- 3) Fire District Advisory Committee One Trustee and three residents from both Medina and Montville Township. City representatives will be Chair of Health Safety, Councilman Mark Kolesar, resident Gary Linden, business owner Mark Williams, and myself. Purpose is to review current operations and discuss need for additional staffing hours or days in relation to our call stats. Once that is reviewed, we will begin process of reviewing the formation of a fire district for all three jurisdictions.
- 4) Thanks to all residents and visitors to the newly renovated and reopened Medina City Pool. Well attended and used, even with some cooler summer days.
- 5) Thanks to Ms. Debra Hallock, for establishing a new nonprofit to raise funds for future needs of Memorial Park and Pool.

Keith Dirham, Finance Director, stated the General Funds Budgets have been submitted and are scheduled for review and those will be started later this week.

Greg Huber, Law Director, had no report.

Lt. Birckbichler, Acting Police Chief, stated on September 6th, officers from the Medina City Police Department in cooperation with Medina County Drug Task Force, US Marshall Service, the DEA, Medina County Sheriff's Office, and Ohio BCI conducted a drug bust in the City of Medina. Total of 29 indictments were handed down, 17 of those were Federal indictments. 12 were State indictments.

Two employees of the Medina Police Department have been called up for active duty to assist in the recovery and rescue operations in Texas and Florida.

Kimberly Marshall, Economic Development Director, had no report.

Jonathon Mendel, Planning Community Director, had no report.

Chief Painter, Fire Chief, Stated the Fire Department will be hosting their annual Open House and Safety Day On Saturday, October 14th from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Fire Station #1 located at 300 W. Reagan Parkway. Free event, rain or shine. There will be emergency vehicles, popcorn, hot dogs and even a helicopter for the kids.

Mike Wright, Recreation Center Director, stated they have a Rec Advisory Committee Meeting on Thursday, September 21st at 7:30 a.m.

Jansen Wehrley, Parks and Recreation Director, Stated the Splashpads are closed for the season as of Labor Day. They just performed a reroute of the mountain bike trail at Huffman and Cunningham Park and ask that the trail users obey the signs.

Dan Gladish, Building Official, had no report.

Patrick Patton, City Engineer, stated the Concrete Street Repair project is well on its way, this is where we replace concrete slabs in the pavement all throughout town. ODOT is starting two bridge projects in the city, one is on N. Harmony, and the other on West Smith. Both locations, the road will have to be closed at the bridge for 90 days. These are city bridges and the State is paying for them.

Nino Piccoli, Service Director, stated that if approved by City Council, the annual City Auction will be Saturday, October 21st at the City garage, 781-West-Smith Road, the preview-will be at 9 a.m. and the auction will start promptly at 10 a.m.

Introduction of Visitors:

Stanley Scheetz, Attorney - 225 East Liberty St. representing and introducing his client Brian Russell. Mr. Russell explained he didn't realize how challenging it would be to get approval on the storage units, especially with the type of smaller homes going up with the need for storage. The site on Rt. 57 across from the Fire Station he felt was a perfect location. He felt it wouldn't offend anyone. These storage units would be for household goods. He has never had any safety troubles with his units. The design doesn't show any windows or doors and esthetically the

buildings would be appealing. He has cameras 24 hours, with low lights on the buildings. No issues with traffic with people coming and going. He spoke with the neighbors and none of them had any concerns. He wishes Council would consider this.

Kevin Lewis, 4945 Mandarin Drive in Seville was here from the Laborer's District Council of Ohio – Laborers-Employers Cooperation and Education Trust Labor Union. He stated he came to do some PR work and is interested in man-hours for when you bid out a project to construction companies. Medina County is part of the Akron Local. They are certified and they are not State funded.

An Ordinance authorizing the Job Creation Grant Agreement for Spray Products Corporation. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 118-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Kimberly Marshall stated this is for the Mayor to enter into a Job Creation Grant Agreement for Spray Products Corporation for the purpose of acquiring a building at 1000 Lake Rd. This agreement has been reviewed and approved by the Law Director. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 118-17 passed by the year votes of B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, and B. Hilberg.

Ord. 119-17

An Ordinance amending Sections 31.02(D), 31.05 and 31.07.7 of the Salaries and Benefits Code of the City of Medina, Ohio relative to the Fire Department. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 119-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Chief Painter stated this is for elimination of the First Assistant Chief position, it was vacated due to retirement. A clean up of the title for the 2nd Assistant Chief Fire Marshal is a full time position and it would change to Assistant Chief Fire Marshall, no change in job description or salary. Lastly, add two part time Lieutenant positions. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 119-17 passed by the yea votes of P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, and B. Lamb.

Res. 120-17

A Resolution authorizing an Application for Grant Assistance from the State of Ohio, Ohio Public Works Commission, relative to Issue 1 and LTIP Program Funding for the South Broadway Reconstruction Project. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 120-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Patton stated they are recommending South Broadway St. for a complete reconstruction of pavement, installation of new storm sewer, water lines and try to save as much of the sidewalks as possible. Grant application will ask for \$478,000. Mr. Lamb stated this is no decision on whether the street is brick or concrete but is hoping for the reconstruction to be in brick without necessitating financing from the property owners. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 120-17 passed by the yea votes of J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb and P. Rose.

Res. 121-17

A Resolution donating fifteen Dell Computers to the Medina City Schools. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 121-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mayor Hanwell

stated these are 15 computers that the City would normally send to auction, the schools can benefit another 4 to 5 years with them. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 121-17 passed by the yea votes of D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb, and P. Rose. J. Shields abstained.

Res. 122-17

A Resolution establishing a Blanket Purchase Order Amount Limit as required by Ohio Revised Code 5705.41 (D)(3). Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 122-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Dirham stated this originated with the audit, these limits already applied but the auditors would like them to be more explicitly applied to blanket purchase orders. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 122-17 passed by the yea votes of J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, and D. Simpson.

Ord. 123-17

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to advertise for the auction, sale or disposal of City equipment and vehicles no longer in use. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 123-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Piccoli stated they have many items for the auction sale on Saturday, October 21st. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 123-17 passed by the yea votes of B. Hilberg, B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, and J. Coyne.

Res. 124-17

A Resolution extending the Intensive Supervision Probation Grant for the Medina Municipal Court through the fiscal year 2019. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 124-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Shields moved that the emergency clause be added to Ordinance/Resolution No. 124-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mayor Hanwell stated this is an annual grant for the Municipal Court to pay for their Intensive Supervision Probation Grant. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, and B. Lamb. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 124-17 passed by the yea votes of B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, and B. Hilberg.

Ord. 125-17

An Ordinance authorizing the purchase of one (1) 2017 Ford F550 4 wheel drive Truck equipped with a utility bed from Montrose Ford for the Street Department. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 125-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Piccoli stated this truck if approved will replace a 1993 International utility sign truck used in the Streets Department. This 550 will serve as an all-purpose truck that will plow snow, pull asphalt trailer and so much more. We are requesting \$60,806. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 125-17 passed by the yea votes of J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb and P. Rose.

Ord. 126-17

An Ordinance amending Section 31.02(B)(6) of the Salaries and Benefits Code of the City of Medina, Ohio relative to the Intensive Supervision Probation employees for the Municipal Court. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 126-17, seconded by Mr.

Simpson. Mr. Shields moved that the emergency clause be added to Ordinance/Resolution No. 126-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mayor Hanwell stated this amends the Salaries and Benefits Code relative to the positions that are funded through this grant as well as the hourly rates for those. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, and D. Simpson. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 126-17 passed by the yea votes of D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb, P. Rose, and J. Shields.

Ord. 127-17

An Ordinance amending the Pavilion Rental Fees for the Parks and Recreation Department. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 127-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Jansen stated this is to change the wording for the garbage removal from per day to per collection to better coordinate with event coordinators for the events we have up on the square. Mr. Lamb feels that the economic benefit outweighs changing the fees and he will vote against. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 127-17 passed by the yea votes of B. Hilberg, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, and J. Coyne. B. Lamb cast a nay vote.

Ord. 128-17

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to accept one (1) Easement necessary for the West Smith Bridge Replacement Project. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 128-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Patton states this easement relates to the West Smith Bridge. Patrick states ODOT is paying for the easement. Mr. Huber stated this is a result of eminent domain case, the property involves Chris Kalina. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 128-17 passed by the yea votes of B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, and B. Hilberg.

Ord. 129-17

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 91-17, passed June 12, 2017, relative to an amendment to the Fire Service Contract between the City of Medina and Medina Township. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 129-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mayor Hanwell stated there are two minor changes to the previous contract with dates and changing that either party can terminate to 12 months. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 129-17 passed by the yea votes of P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, and B. Lamb.

Ord. 130-17

An Ordinance amending Sections 31.13(2)(C) and 31.16 of the Salaries and Benefits Code of the City of Medina, Ohio relative to Vacation and Group Hospitalization. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 130-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Shields moved that the emergency clause be added to Ordinance/Resolution No. 130-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Dirham stated these were somethings left off when we made the Salaries and Benefits Code match to what the contracts are, and the emergency clause is needed because they are currently somewhat undefined. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb, P. Rose, and J. Shields. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 130-17 passed by the yea votes of J. Shields,

D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb and P. Rose.

Ord. 131-17

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 63-17, passed May 8, 2017 relative to the Job Creation Grant Agreement for Carlisle Brake & Friction, Inc. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 131-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mrs. Marshall stated that after the agreement was signed, their attorney wanted verbiage in contract to include Friction Products Company, as they are a wholly owned subsidiary of Carlisle Brake & Friction and is the actual entity creating the jobs. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 131-17 passed by the yea votes of J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, and D. Simpson.

Ord. 132-17

An Ordinance amending Sections 1127.04 and 1127.05 of the Planning and Zoning Code of the City of Medina, Ohio pertaining to Conditionally Permitted Uses in the R-4 District, and Lot Development Standards. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 132-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Huber stated the applicant requests that we amend our zoning code and add as a conditionally permitted use low rise residential storage unit. Planning Commission voted against the request. Six council members would have to vote to modify what the Planning Commission did, otherwise we don't meet the requirements of the code section. Mr. Rose stated the Planning Commission voted 0-5 nays. Mr. Rose does not feel this is something the residents want to see as they are first coming into the city. Mr. Lamb feels differently, he thinks if you look at the property and you look at other pieces of properties that are available where these kind of facilities can be built with the zoning change, it is extremely limited. When you look at the piece of property, and you look at the adjoining residential properties, it makes a lot of sense. There are commercial buildings on every entrance into the city. Mr. Simpson stated he is in support of this, he respects the Planning Commission's vote. He feels the 24 housing unit would have a bigger impact on the infrastructure. Mr. Mendel stated this zoning code change would basically be applied across the city. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 132-17 failed by the nay votes of B. Hilberg, P. Rose and J. Coyne.

Ord. 133-17

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 167-16, passed December 12, 2016. (Amendments to 2017 Budget) Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 133-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Dirham stated these are amendments related to transfers for the Bicentennial. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 133-17 passed by the yea votes of B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, and B. Hilberg.

Ord. 134-17

An Ordinance authorizing the Finance Director to make certain fund Advances. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 134-17, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Shields motioned to amend the ordinance from a fund transfer to a fund advance, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Dirham stated for this ordinance and the next, they were going to be transfers, we are amending them to advances. The purpose is if there is money left over at the end they could be repaid, they are to fund the Bicentennial celebration. The roll was called on the amendment and passed by the yea votes of J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, B. Lamb and P. Rose.

The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 134-17 passed by the yea votes of P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, and B. Lamb.

Ord. 135-17

WHEREAS:	Men with relatives – father, brother, son – with a history of prostate cancer are twice as likely to develop the disease and		
WHEREAS:	Veterans are 1.5 times more likelyto get prostate cancer, and		
WHEREAS:	Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed form of cancer in American Men and the third leading cause of cancer death behind lung and colon cancer; and		
WHEREAS:	This year approximately 161,360 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in the United States alone every year—that's one man every 3.3 minutes and roughly 26,730-will die this year from the disease—which is one man every 20 minutes; and		
WHEREAS:	1 in 8 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer. African American men are at the highest risk for the disease with a rate of 1 in 6 men; African American men are 2.3 times more likely to die from the disease; and		
WHEREAS:	Education regarding prostate cancer and early detection strategies are critical to saving lives and preserving and protectingour families; and		
WHEREAS:	All men are at risk for prostate cancer and we encourage the citizens of Medina to increase the importance of prostate screenings.

AGREEMENT FOR RECIPROCAL BACKUP CHIEF BUILDING OFFICIAL SERVICES

This Agreement, by and between the CITY OF MEDINA, located at 132 North Elmwood Avenue, Medina, Ohio 44256, and the CITY OF BRUNSWICK, located at 4095 Center Road, Brunswick, Ohio 44212 (collectively the "Cities").

WHEREAS, the Building Departments of the Cities are certified building departments pursuant to the rules and regulations for certification promulgated by the Ohio Board of Building Standards; and

WHEREAS, the Cities have and will continue to have in their employ full-time personnel meeting the specific requirements of the Board of Building Standards so as to enforce the provisions of the Ohio Building Code; and

WHEREAS, the Cities are desirous of contracting with the other for the purpose of having the Chief Building Official of each respective City act as "backup personnel" to the other City as required by Ohio Administrative Code Rule 4101:1-1-03 Section 103.2.6. The Brunswick Chief Building Official would act as backup personnel in place of the Chief Medina City Building Official in the event that the Chief Medina City Building Official cannot act as a result of a conflict of interest or other event resulting in the unavailability of the Chief Medina City Building Official and vice versa; and

WHEREAS, by and through Ordinance No	_ the Council of the City of Medina
authorized the Mayor to enter into this Agreement with the	City of Brunswick; and
WHEREAS, by and through Resolution No.	_ the Council of the City of
Brunswick authorized the City Manager/Safety Director to	enter into this Agreement with the
City of Medina.	

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

SECTION I - SCOPE OF SERVICES

Upon the written request of the Chief Building Official of a City hereto, the other City agrees to make available its Chief Building Official who will provide the requesting City professional services as a certified building official in the event that the Chief Building Official of the requesting City is unable to serve as a result of a conflict of interest or other event that results in unavailability. In this manner, the Chief Building Official will serve as backup personnel as required by Ohio Administrative Code Rule 4101:1-1-03 Section 103.2.6. Upon being asked to serve as a backup building official, the Chief Building Official will have authority to interpret and require compliance with the Ohio Building Code and each respective City's applicable Codified Ordinances in connection with duties that are undertaken as a backup building official.

SECTION II - TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Agreement shall commence on the date of execution of this Agreement, and shall continue until terminated by either party hereto.

SECTION III - PAYMENT

The Cities agree to provide the services of their respective Chief Building Official pursuant to this Agreement free of charge, with the exception of services provided for a period of time in excess of three (3) consecutive weeks. If the services provided exceed three (3) consecutive weeks, each City agrees to reimburse the City providing such services at a rate of 1.5 times the hourly rate for the official for actual time providing such services, which shall include one-half (½) hour drive time for each day servicing the other City. The City providing the service will invoice the City receiving the service every two (2) weeks for hours and days that services were provided, which shall be paid within ten (10) days of receipt thereof.

SECTION IV - AGENCY

It is expressly understood and agreed that in the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement, the Chief Building Official shall act as an agent of the requesting City. However, in every other respect, the Chief Building Official will be an independent contractor and neither party shall be deemed a servant, employee, or representative of the other.

SECTION V - PLANS AND DOCUMENTS

All applications, construction documents, reports, design notes, inspection records, and all other documents submitted to or prepared by either City, its employees, and the Chief Building Official, which are in the possession of the Chief Building Official, shall be and remain public records of each respective City and shall be furnished or returned to the appropriate City's Building Department immediately upon request.

SECTION VI - TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time and for any reason upon written notice to the other thirty (30) days from the date upon which written notice of termination is given. Termination under this section shall not give rise to any claims by one party as against the other.

SECTION VII - ASSIGNMENT

The parties hereto agree that they shall not assign, transfer, convey, pledge, sublet, or otherwise dispose of this Agreement without the prior written consent of the parties hereto.

SECTION VIII - TIME OF PERFORMANCE

The work to be performed pursuant to the terms of this Agreement shall commence promptly and shall be pursued diligently and completed promptly and within the time parameters established for the performance of such work according to applicable provisions of the Ohio Building Code. Time is of the essence in the performance of all phases of this Agreement.

SECTION IX - INSURANCE

The Chief Building Official, in the performance of his/her duties pursuant to this Agreement, shall be insured by the requesting City's Comprehensive General Liability coverage and Professional Liability Insurance. All required insurances shall be maintained with responsible insurance carriers qualified to do business in the State of Ohio and approved by the State Superintendent of Insurance.

SECTION X -AMENDMENTS

Amendments, modifications, or changes to this Agreement shall-not be effective unless in writing and approved by both parties to this Agreement.

SECTION XI-NOTICES

Except as otherwise provided herein, any notice, approval, acceptance, request, demand, or statement hereunder from either party to the other shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given when either delivered personally or deposited in a U. S. mailbox in a postage prepaid envelope addressed to the other party. Either party may, at any time, change such address by delivering or mailing as aforesaid to the other party a notice stating the change and the changed address.

SECTION XII - CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The Chief Building Officials of the Cities covenants that they have no interest nor shall they acquire any interest, directly or indirectly, which will conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of this Agreement.

SECTION XIII - DISCRIMINATION PROHIBITED

In performing the services required under this Agreement, the Chief Building Officials shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of gender, race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, age, or physical handicap.

SECTION XIV - EXTENT OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement represents the entire and integrated Agreement between the City of Medina and the City of Brunswick that supersedes any and all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral. It shall not be changed, amended, or modified without the prior written approval of both parties hereto.

SECTION XV - EFFECTIVE AND BINDING

This Agreement shall not become effective or binding upon the City of Medina unless and until Medina City Council shall have authorized the Mayor to execute the same. This agreement shall not become effective and binding upon the City of Brunswick until the Brunswick City Council shall have authorized the City Manager/Safety Director to execute same.

SECTION XVI - CAPTIONS AND HEADNOTES

The captions or headnotes on articles or sections of this Agreement, and marginal notes are intended for convenience and reference purposes only and in no way define, limit, or describe the scope or intent thereof, or of this Agreement, nor in any way affect the Agreement.

If the encroachments are removed or destroyed, no new facilities shall be permitted to encroach on Medina Street right-of-way without the express, written consent of the CITY OF MEDINA. The encroachments for which this permit is issued shall be subject to all permits required by the CITY OF MEDINA. RESOLUTION NO. 142-17

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S SPEED EVALUATION STUDY FOR STATE ROUTE 18.

- WHEREAS: The Ohio Department of Transportation is currently preparing plans for improvements to State Route 18 (ODOT Project MED-18-12.99 (PID 92953)), and that as part of that project development, the establishment of legal speed limits is required for the entire length of the project including that portion of the project within the City of Medina (from Alber Drive to the City's eastern boundary); and
- WHEREAS: The Ohio Department of Transportation has reviewed sections of State Route 18 within the city corporation limits that currently have posted speed limits that are not journalized and do not meet the prima facie speed limit set forth in the Ohio Revised Code. Therefore, the existing 35 mph speed limit and part of the existing 25 mph speed limit are not legal due to lacking journalization. The roadway was studied and evaluated for compliance with the Ohio Revised Code (§4511.21); and
- WHEREAS: In addition to the sections of State Route 18 that are in the project, the Ohio Department of Transportation State Route 18 Speed Zone Study also recommends that sections of State Route 18 from South Jefferson Street to South Spring Grove Street also appears to be improperly signed at 25mph. This section meets the primafacie speed limit of 35 mph (§4511.21.B.3). It is recommended that the city rectify this by accepting the prima-facie speed limit and signing the road appropriately.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEDINA, OHIO:

- SEC. 1: That the City hereby concurs in the findings of the State Route 18 Medina Speed zone Study completed by the Ohio Department of Transportation as set forth in the attached, marked Exhibit A and incorporated herein, and commits to enforcement of the guidelines set forth therein pursuant to Ohio Revised Code §4511.21 (I)(1).
- SEC. 2: The City of Medina will install the necessary regulatory signage reflecting the findings of the State Route 18 Medina Speed Zone Study
- SEC. 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

MEDINA 18 SPEED ZONES

Mr. Patton,

The establishment of legal speed limits is required for the MED-18-12.99 (PID 92953) project from Alber Drive to Nettleton Road. The Ohio Department of Transportation has reviewed sections of State Route 18 within the city corporation limits that currently have posted speed limits that are not journalized and do not meet the prima facie speed limit set forth in the Ohio Revised Code. Therefore, the existing 35mph speed limit and part of the existing 25mph speed limit are not legal.

The roadway was studied and evaluated for compliance with the Ohio Revised Code (\$4511.21). Details on this study can be found attached. Currently, the section of SR 18 from South Spring Grove Street to a point 0.28 miles east of South Spring Grove Street is signed as 25mph and the section from a point .28 miles east of South Spring Grove Street to a point 0.21 miles west of Foote Road is signed at 35mph. Based on the results of our speed zone study, a 35mph speed limit is warranted from South Spring Grove Street to a point 0.21 miles west of Foote Road. Acceptance of this speed zone would establish a legal speed limit of 35 MPH. A majority of this segment is currently signed at 35 MPH. The city would be responsible for signing State Route 18 adjacent to Spring Grove Cemetery at 35 MPH, currently posted at 25 MPH. The establishment of legal speed limits needs to be completed for the Medina 18 Widening project to proceed.

State Route 18 from South Jefferson Street to South Spring Grove Street also appears to be improperly signed at 25 MPH. This section meets the prima-facie speed limit of 35 MPH (§4511.21.B.3). It is recommended that the city rectify this by either accepting the prima-facie speed limit and signing the road appropriately or performing a speed zone study to establish a more appropriate speed limit if deemed necessary.
