America 250 Medina Upcoming Events

March 2 thru 27: In celebration of Women’s History Month and America 250, the Medina Library is hosting an interactive touchscreen exhibit from the National First Ladies Museum in Canton. “American Icons, The Untold Stories of Ohio’s Presidential First Ladies” includes narratives often left out of history books, but vital to understanding the women who helped shape the American presidencies. The display is free to view during the library’s regular hours at 210 South Broadway.

March 21: Medina Town Hall & Engine House Museum at 50 Public Square will be open from 11 am to 3 pm. Learn more about the history of Medina. Admission is free.

City of Medina Income Tax

All city residents age 18 and over are required to file a city income tax return with the Regional Income Tax Agency (RITA) by April 15.
