Medina Curbside Yard Waste Pick-up to Begin April 6

- Place in plastic or metal containers only; rubbish cans under 40 gallons in size are preferred. Label the container with large, colored letters saying **YARD WASTE**.
- Don't mix yard waste with rubbish. Yard waste in plastic or paper bags will not be collected. Bundle cut branches with string or twine into 4 foot lengths or less and no wider than 2 feet. The weight of each bundle or container must be under 35 pounds.
- Yard waste is organic waste generated during regular household gardening and landscaping, including: grass clippings, leaves, twigs, branches, and shrubbery. **Do not include rocks, dirt, sod, plastic pots/bags, food waste, or gravel.**
- Place at curbside on the day of your regular pick up by 6:00 am.
